It's hard to believe that I am half way through my term; it just seemed like yesterday that we were having out first council meeting. Since I'm halfway through I thought I'd take some time to highlight some of the things I've been working on in relations to my goals.

Mental Health Accessibility

UASU Cares is live and we will be doing a marketing campaign this month targeting the second half of midterms, I'm eager to see the utility of this resource. Beyond that I have formed an internal committee with our staff to engage in conversations pertaining to mental health and see how we can move forward to increase services and access of information to students.

My primary goal is to strengthen the mental health network as a whole on campus and I'm confident the university is moving in a positive direction. We have formed a mental health providers committee with all stakeholders on campus and eager to have conversations on how we can better collaborate and work together to ensure students' needs are met.

Athletics and Recreation

A lot of students are not aware of the all access they have to the Golden Bears and Pandas games, and we have been working closely with athletics to foster an environment where students are engaged with our athletes and understand the benefits they get while being a student here. We've had numerous talks and I look forward to creating events in partnership with athletics.

Residence Associations

I have worked closely with each residence association to address any concerns they have within their residence. As a council of residence associations chair I have began working on annual reports for each residence in order to document advocacy and aid my position in



the future as well. I'm pretty thrilled to say that we will have PLH Representatives soon, and hopefully a new residence association for this new residence for the upcoming year.

Student Groups

The draft of the policies you have seen has changed significantly and I assume it will make it's way back to council in the future, I have been in many meetings contesting points on this policy and ensuring that students have a thorough transparent process when it comes to any interactions with student groups. In the meantime, we have been working on our own policies for Students' Union student groups. I'm confident that our documents will guide students in terms of anything to do with student groups and allow them to express themselves and find an identity beyond academia.

BearsDen

I have been in many conversations discussing this platform and we are looking for many options on how we can change the software, or generate new software that fits our needs more accurately. The primary problem is that when BearsDen was designed, it was set out to be a social media, it is not. It services great as a data base and a resource website, but it lacks the promotional tools, hence us looking at an Event Calendar, which will be coming up here by the end of the year. All the conversations have been preliminary and I will keep you updated on any progress.

Campus Activities Board

I spoke about the lack of diversity of events within the SU portfolio in my campaign last year; well creating this board celebrates event diversity. The board is currently looking at event submissions and will be deciding what event we should put on this year; I'm quite excited and thrilled to see what we come up with.

In The News

We have been in the news! The executive was quoted on CTV, CBC, and a multitude of news sources across the city. My comments on budget cuts made it onto a few platforms, including <u>The Gateway</u> and <u>The Metro</u>.

As well, the launch of <u>The Flame</u> went through on October 31st! I am absolutely thrilled with this University of Alberta Students Union initiative, as i've been a big proponent that we need to redevelop our online presence for some time. Grand Council of Indigenous Elders

On October 18th the executive and I attended the Grand Council of Indigenous Elders. A new initiative to bring together indigenous alumni and establish a working group to push the University of Alberta towards reconciliation, it was an amazing reception. A close family friend Elmer Ghostkeeper is one of the leaders of the gathering, and it was amazing to see him there.

Meetings

On October 20th President Banister and I attended a drop-in meeting with Minister Marlin Schmidt. We were largely there to support students from Campus Saint-Jean, who all lived in the Minister's riding, and we were thrilled to see them present their priorities for the campus.



On October 27th VP Paches and I met with Lori Sigurdson for a CFEP grant presentation. They found their big cheque!



On November 1st Josh and I attended a stakeholder meeting with Public Interest Alberta for their Post Secondary Education Taskforce. They have adopted a number of CAUSes priorities into their own and will are fantastic allies from students in PSE.

Open House

On October 21st the entire executive team was at Ualberta Open House. It was a lively day and overall was great to see so many engaged youth coming to the University of Alberta

CAUS Presentations, Check In's, & Advocacy Days

On October 23rd, 24th and 25th I travelled across Alberta with the CAUS interim director Josh Mckeown. We did council presentations to the Student Association of Mount Royal and the University of Lethbridge Students Union, as well as doing check-ins with the University of Calgary Students Union and the Student Association of MacEwan University. The big takeaway is that CAUS will be redeveloping its priorities on mental health and tuition, updates that will be coming early next week. <u>Check out the Gaunlet</u> for coverage from our visit to UCSU in early October.

CAUS is also undergoing its fall advocacy days from November 5th, 6th, and 7th. Concurrently this year's 2nd Counterpart Conference will be ongoing. We will be meeting with government, the United Conservative Party, Alberta Party, and Alberta Liberal Party caucuses. We expect for it to be

Hello Council,

It is hard to believe my term as President is already half over. It truly has flown by.

It has been a busy few weeks since my last report! Please find an update on my work below.

SU Business/Internal Projects

Cultural Group First Meeting

I hosted my first round table meeting for international student and cultural student groups! The meeting had low attendance but excellent discussion. All members in attendance agreed the meetings are beneficial and that we should be twice a semester moving forward. The purpose of the group is to get advice on SU advocacy, help facilitate connections in our community, and to better support students who come from various cultural backgrounds.

STRIDE

The executive and I will be attending a STRIDE meeting soon. At the meeting the executive will be on a panel about our experiences as well as help with advocacy training.

Student Rights

After lengthy discussions with SU staff, I have re-conceptualized my goals around student rights. Instead of using a top down model of striking a committee first, we have decided to do more research into the landscape of existing rights on campus. After this research, we will do thorough consultation on where students feel like there are gaps in their rights on campus and then do a campaign highlighting the existing resources. After this point we will have a better understanding of where the most urgent areas of need are, so the later formed committee can start working with more direction.



University Business

University Governance Meetings

In the past few weeks I have attended a Board of Governors dinner and meeting. The most notable item discussed at that meeting was the upcoming proposed faculty based cuts. The University has done a press release on the cuts, which can be found <u>https://blog.ualberta.ca/clarification-on-preliminary-budget-planning-parameters-</u> <u>183b82caed4e</u>. VP Scott and I are working with Faculty Associations to make sure students are consulted about what the proposed cuts to their faculty may look like. VP Larsen and I are also keeping a keen eye on the government to see any potential response to the University's statement. I am happy to answer any questions about this.

I attended a General Faculty Council and Academic Planning Committee meeting. The GFC meeting had several robust discussions regarding the PLLC, USRI's, and changes coming to graduate students. VP Scott can provide more information on these items.

VP Paches, VP Ushakov, and I attended a Mandatory Non-Instructional Fee Oversight committee meeting. This is the first meeting I have been able to attend since I have taken office as President. At the meeting we discussed the Academic Price Index as well as student priorities for the spending of MNIFs.

Grand Council of Indigenous Elders

The executive and I attended a dinner for the formation of the Grand Council of Indigenous Elders. It was a very powerful event where indigenous alumni shared their story about their experience here at the U of A.

External Business

Provincial

VP Larsen and I had a meeting with Doug Schweitzer, former United Conservative Party leadership hopeful, where we discussed post-secondary issues. Mr. Schweitzer was very receptive to our meeting and it was productive. VP Larsen and I also dropped into an informal consultation gathering that Minister Marlin Schmidt was hosting. Many students from CSJ were at the event, since that is the Ministers riding.

In the upcoming week the executive and I will be attending the CAUS/Counterpart conference in Edmonton. This is where all the executives from ULSU, SAMRU, SAMU, and UCSU come together to discuss our work. At the same time, VP Larsen and I will be



participating in fall advocacy days where we meet with different MLA's to discuss post secondary issues.

<u>Federal</u>

I will be attending an Internal Review Committee meeting for CASA in the coming days. I have been underwhelmed with the work of the committee so far and keenly anticipate what will get done in the coming meetings.

Other Exciting Endeavors

Media Appearances and Speaking Events

I have been speaking at lots of events in the past few weeks. These include a conference for young community leaders hosted by the Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation and a conference for Alberta Health Professionals. At both events I spoke about the importance of student advocacy, diverse perspectives in politics, and the work we do at UASU.

I have had some recent media appearances in my capacity as President. These include a post-election analysis of the municipal election on CBC, an interview with CBC regarding sexual violence on campus, and participated in a fun segment on CJSR to help raise money in their annual fundraising show.

Everything else!

VP Larsen, VP Scott, VP Paches, and I attended a tour of the new U of A Islamic Botanical Gardens. It is an absolutely beautiful venue and I cannot wait to return in the summer when it has been completed.

The executive and I had a dinner with the Alberta Pharmacy Students' Association. It was a very fruitful and fun meeting. We have been working with APSA very regularly over the past few years, as they have had a chance in their faculty administration and we have been helping with the transition process.

The Students' Union had our annual Awards Night where we give out over \$100,000 in awards! From the décor, to the keynote speaker, to the awards given out – it was a spectacular event! Congratulations to all the Councilors who received awards.

The executive and I watched "Get Out" in the Myer Horowitz on Halloween. It was very spooky.

Hello Council,

I hope everyone is having a good semester! It's been extra busy in my office

Faculty Associations

The Council of Faculty Associations (COFA) had meetings of 3 boards. The Senior Board had representation from 10 faculties, Advocacy Board had 8 faculties, and Finance and Administration 7. All of these boards discussed current events in relating to student governance, shared information on FA events and gave general updates. Finance and Administration board also had a presentation from Students' Council Audit Committee on the FA audit process.

I have been notified of 3 Faculty Associations looking to pursue the creation or increase in a faculty association membership fee. This includes the Organization for Arts Students and Interdisciplinary Studies (OASIS), L'Association des universitaires de la Faculté Saint-Jean (AUFSJ), and the Engineering Students' Society (ESS). These groups are required to submit proposals for their FAMFs by December 15th for the referendum question to be added for the 2018 election cycle and implementation in Fall 2018.

General Faculties Council

At the October 30th meeting of General Faculties Council we discussed several topics relating to undergraduate students including the future of the Peter Lougheed Leadership College, the ongoing work of the Ad-Hoc Transition Committee, Report of the GFC Committee on the Learning Environment (CLE) on Teaching and Learning and Teaching Evaluation and the Use of Universal Student Ratings of Instruction (USRI) as an Evaluation Tool, and Changes to the Admission of Aboriginal Students Calendar Section and updates to Faculty sections. It was announced that the PLLC may be heading in a new direction in years to come and will require new leadership. The discussion on the use of USRIs as an evaluative tool proved to be contentious and focused on necessity for a multi-faceted approach and a recognition of implicit biases in the USRI tool. The changes around aboriginal admissions reflected extensive consultation to update language in the calendar to reflect "aboriginal identity" and to list the types of identification that can be used to prove it when necessary.

Academic Standards Committee, Subcommittee on Standards

At the November 2nd meeting we discussed the proposed New Bachelor of Arts in Modern Languages and Cultural Studies (MLCS) and the associated suspensions in the Department of Modern Language and Cultural Studies. This proposal will see the suspension of all 8 of the current MLCS programs for one new, consolidated BA in

MLCS. We also discussed proposed changes to existing Academic Standing Requirements for Faculté Saint-Jean regarding probation. This is largely a good decision for students at CSJ as it will give them better flexibility when they're on probation.

Committee on the Learning Environment

At the November 1st meeting we discussed the Proposed Student Groups Policy Suite, and Open Education at the University of Alberta .

Peter Lougheed Leadership College, Academic Oversight Committee

The Academic Oversight Committee for the Peter Lougheed Leadership College met for the first time in a number of months. This conversation was distinct from the general conversation held at the whole GFC as it focused specifically on the current academic program and the courses associated with it. Issues around program communication, course oversight and academic quality were all raised. The next meeting should be at the start of December.

GovCamp Lite

New student members of the General Faculties Council attended a "GovCamp Lite", a hybrid version of the summer program which many members of council experienced. It was a much more condensed program and included an overview of Students Union and University governance, and the student representatives role in that structure. It was hosted by Discover Governance.

Botanical Gardens Tour

The Students' Union Executive was given a tour of the new Aga Khan Garden at the University of Alberta Botanic Garden. The garden construction was made possible by a \$25 million donation by His Highness the Aga Khan. This garden is only the 11th to be supported by the Aga Khan in the world, and only the second in north america. The construction is set to be complete by June 2018.

SU Awards Night

I am honored to have been able to co-host the SU Awards night with VP Ushakov. The Students' Union gave out over \$100k in student awards. A special thanks is owed to those who planned the wonderful evening and to the sponsors of all the awards. And finally, congratulations to all of the award recipients.

I can still remember the first time I went to Augustana Campus, during my first year on the Students' Union as a Business Councilor. Ah, how time flies. Over the past few weeks, a lot has happened. We have had a couple exciting announcements; we have had some notable meetings as well as attended some events. I will go over those in the following report.

Student Events Initiative

This last Tuesday on Halloween, we officially launched the Student Events Initiative! In celebration of SUB's 50th anniversary, we are bolstering programming in the building and starting a heavy consultation process our various renovation plans. We will be having at least one major event in the building each month for the remainder of the semester, and our new Engagement Team will be out on campus consulting with students about our plans for growth within the building. This is a very exciting project; if you would like to find ways to get involved please do not hesitate to reach out.

CFEP Grant

I am happy to announce the Students' Union was successful in securing a \$125,000 grant for the Myer Horowitz Theatre Project from the Community Facilities Enhancement Program (CFEP) offered by the Government of Alberta! This last Friday, October 27th VP Larsen and I visited Minister Lori Sigurdson, the MLA responsible for the University of Alberta. The Minister presented us with a cheque for the grant. Combined with the \$40,000 CFEP grant from last year, this almost covers the costs of design and planning of the project.

BoG/GSA/SU Lunch

On Friday October 20th, the executive, the Graduate Students' Association (GSA) and the Board of Governors members had lunch in Triffo Hall. The GSA hosted the lunch, and it was an excellent opportunity to meet the members of the highest governing body of the university. We had a great time, and created some excellent connections.

Open House

October 21st was the U of A Open House! The executive and I worked at open house for most of the day. We had a booth in the Butterdome at the main event, and were



redirecting people to SUB where we had games and other activities set up. We had a ton of fun! I always enjoy speaking to prospective students about the possibility of coming to the U of A. Their energy is always inspiring and invigorating.

CAHRD

On October 24th, VP Ushakov and I attended the Coalition Against High Risk Drinking. This is a collaborative committee between various members of the U of A community, including the Dean of Students, the SU and the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission. At this meeting we talked more about what the U of A will do in response to the legalization of cannabis. The discussion was productive and interesting. Moral of the story: this will present many challenges on campuses across Canada.

MNIF Oversight Committee

On Monday, October 30th, VP Ushakov, President Banister, and I attended a meeting of the Mandatory Non-Instructional Fee (MNIF) Oversight Committee. This committee is a joint committee between all departments that receive funds from MNIFs, the SU, GSA and the Office of the Provost. I presented an update on the Student Events Initiative and details on the Myer Horowitz Theatre Renovation Project. I dived into details on the design of the renovation, and took questions from the committee. A couple of the committee members were interested in the project, and I will be following up with some members.
