General Faculties Council - #UAGFC

Attended my first ever meeting of the University of Alberta General Faculties Council on May 28th where motions were put forth to terminate a few Arts programs with no enrolment. With little debate on two of the motions, all four were passed and moved up to the Board Learning & Discovery Committee (#BLDC) where they have subsequently moved up to the Board of Governors for final approval. After the meeting, was able to hang around and chat with a few of the other GFC members during a small Meet & Greet session facilitated by VPA Bhatnagar and look forward to a larger and more formal one towards the beginning of the Fall term.

On June 4th, I was able to participate in a <u>Governance 101</u> session facilitated by Marion Haggarty-France, University Secretary. And despite being in governance for a while now, I was able to come out of that session knowing a couple of things more than I did going in. It was attended not only by elected student representatives such as myself and GSA President Sasha van der Klein, but other members of university governance of all levels as well as other university staff who aren't directly involved in governance but may aid in governance in some way, shape or form. I would recommend to anyone who hasn't gone through this session at least once to sit in at least once. Got to meet the folks I'll be working with on the committee for the next year, we approved a motion to recommend Board of Governors approval on the University of Alberta Annual Report to the Government of Alberta and got to get a brief update of recent updates and events which were coming up fast. Probably the biggest blip on anyone's radar over the last couple of months was the decision to confer an honorary Doctor of Science degree to Dr. David Suzuki. Initial reaction was overwhelmingly negative leading to many donors to redirect or outright pull funding but leading up to convocation, sentiment shifted and today is moderately positive. It appears at least for the time being that the Suzuki Storm has passed but we'll have to wait and see what the future holds.

Also, the official name for Lister 5 has been chosen. Can't share what it is just yet, but it should be announced coming up soon this Summer.

During our May 15th meeting of Students' Council, we were honored to invite members of the <u>Kiskinohamatowin Blanket Exercise Group</u> to come perform the <u>KAIROS Blanket Exercise</u>, a teaching tool designed to share the historic and contemporary relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada. At first, I was considered "fortunate" to be one of the few that managed to stay in until the very end but that came at the cost of <u>Enfranchisement</u>, a legal process for terminating a person's Indian status and conferring full Canadian citizenship. See me here on my "graduation day" but notice that it isn't really a cause for celebration because in gaining an education, I would be losing my status due to the <u>Indian Act of 1876</u>. All in all, would highly recommend anyone to participate in this activity and would do so again if presented the opportunity.



At our last meeting, I was elected to serve on the First Alberta Campus Radio Association Board of Directors for a fourth term. We had a meeting on Thursday evening to propose a policy change regarding the Board of Directors nomination and election process which will go up for a vote at a Special General Meeting called for July 5th which if passed, will take effect in time for our Annual General Meeting in late August.

Hit a bit of a snag with Council Jackets in Council Administration committee, but I'm confident we'll still have them in hand prior to Week of Welcome.
