The University of Alberta and the University of Alberta Students' Union occupy Indigenous land in amiskwacîswâskahikan (Beaver Hills House), on Treaty 6 territory. From time immemorial, the banks along the river valley have been known as the Pehonan, a meeting place for the nêhiyawak (Cree), the Niitsítapi (Blackfoot), Métis, Dënesųliné (Dene), Ojibway/Saulteaux/Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee and others. The University, the Students' Union and much of the city are located on the unlawfully stolen land of the forcibly removed Papaschase Cree.

We acknowledge that sharing this land gives each of us the responsibility to research the historic contexts of Treaty 6, to reflect on our personal relationships to the land, the Nations we've named, and to our roles in upholding justice on this territory. Since they began, the Students' Union and the University have benefited from historic and ongoing dispossession of land and resources from Indigenous Peoples. As a result, it is our responsibility to seek the restitution of this land and its resources. Finally, we seek to do better by working to make our learning, research, and governance align with the histories, languages, teachings, and cultures of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Peoples in the land presently occupied by the Canadian state.

We encourage critical reflection by asking the following question. In relation to the territory on which you are situated, what role do you play in strengthening the resistance and resurgence of Indigenous students within your communities?

Furthermore, working closely with the Student Group Services as part of the InfoLink team, I came to realize that many more student groups than I thought go through major conflicts every year. One memorable instance was a complaint letter we received from a student group explaining that they were subject to the new re-registration policy on Bearsden that requires student groups with greater than \$5,000 in assets and cash to procure insurance, which per se placed the group in an existential crisis. They searched for months for insurance companies to purchase insurance, only to be rejected and find out that their requests were not treated with seriousness. Having witnessed such issues and concerns. I could sense the passion and desire to make changes in myself, now looking to assist student groups with administrative errands so that they can focus on their initiatives to keep the campus community vibrant and moving forward. In other words, serving on the Student Group Committee. I intend to 1) facilitate administrative procedures for student groups 2) and provide them with support and advocacy in case of conflicts.

Policy Committee: As the VP Public Relations of a student group, my duties included contacting external organizations on campus and professors to organize joint events. For example, I was assigned the role of assisting the President with contacting other science departments for an interdepartmental trivia night, answering inquiries and coordinating everyone's schedule. Moreover, in my position as the President of another student group, I applied my experience from the other position to organize a department night, but single-handedly communicating with professors this time. To this date. I have learned to effectively communicate with other people out of my comfort zone, now able to deliver messages with succinctness and precaution. From this experience of mine, I have become literate in the interactions with people from different organizations, therefore able to orient our political policies in the right direction to serve the best interest of everyone working toward advocacy for
